This allows us to examine cinematic storytelling when its intention is to capture reality, and how film techniques differ and are effectively utilised for this format.



Coursework


At the end of Year 12 students create a film product. This can either be a short film, or a script with an accompanying storyboard.

An evaluative essay is also submitted which demonstrates inspirations and understanding.



What does 100 minutes mean for us?

- □ The 100 minute lessons allow us more time for analysis development.
- Screenings take place across only four lessons, reducing opportunities to miss core parts of a texts or gaps in recollection.
- We can explore the content to a greater depth than that available to us in shorter lessons, and build a professional understanding of the exam criteria in a way that is both effective and exciting.
